Identification

All adults (including parents) should be prepared to show a picture ID at pick-up. If a person other than a parent is picking up their child, the parent must provide a written note with the persons name and contact number to the Community Education Summer Programs Office.

Lunch/Snack

If your child is participating in a full day Program, s/he is expected to bring their own lunch.

What to Wear

Your child should dress appropriately for his/her Enrichment Program. Comfortable, casual play clothes and closed-toe shoes are ideal. The summer staff will assist participants with application of SPRAY ON sunscreen and insect repellent only if the parent has signed the Sunscreen and Insect Repellent Permission located on the registration. Please mark all personal items with your child's name. We will not be held responsible for missing items.

Behavior Expectations

All Summer Program participants are expected to behave in a respectful, kind, and safe manner while attending any program with Westborough Community Education. The Director and Enrichment Coordinator reserve the right to dismiss any participant when that participant's behavior interferes with the rights and safety of others.

Medication Administration Policy (105 CMR 430.160A, C)

Medication prescribed for participants shall be kept in original containers bearing the pharmacy label, which shows the date of filling, the pharmacy name and address, the filling pharmacist's initials, the serial number of the prescription, the name of the patient, the name of the prescribing practitioner, the name of the prescribed medication, directions for the use, the cautionary statements, if any, contained in such prescription or required by law, and if tablets or capsules, the number in the container. **All medication must be accompanied by a physician note and parent note authorizing administration.** Medication shall be administered by the Health Supervisor, the Director, the Covering Supervisor, or by a licensed health care professional authorized to administer prescription medication.

Our Summer Enrichment Programs are licensed by the Westborough Board of Health. Additionally, our Summer Camp Programs comply with regulations of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health. Staff Qualifications

All Enrichment Instructors have significant experience working with children. All instructors undergo a criminal background check (CORI) and a sexual offender registry check (SORI) before the start of enrichment.

Summer Enrichment Registration Deadlines

Registration deadlines for Summer Enrichment Programs are two weeks before the start date (unless otherwise noted in class description), however if the program is running, we will accept registrations after the deadline on a program by program basis and a late fee of \$20 will be charged. There is no registration fee to participate in our Summer Enrichment Programs. Please note: Tuition paid to Westborough Community Education Program for child care purposes is tax deductible. **Town of Westborough Tax Identification Number is 046 001 355. Please list "Town of Westborough" as the provider.**

Payment Policy

Payment for Summer Enrichment Programs is **DUE** at the time of registration. If mailing in a registration, please send the check in with the registration form. Checks should be made out to WCEP. **Please write separate checks for each class and write the name of your child in the memo section.** If registering online, please pay via the online payment link that can be found on our website.

Refund Policy

Refunds will be granted for verifiable medical emergencies only (e.g. doctor note). All requests for refunds must be submitted in writing to Maryellen Feeney (feeneym@westboroughk12.org), the Community Education Director. No credit will be issued for missed days.

Full-Day Program Option

We offer a full-day option for both morning and afternoon Enrichment Program participants. Half-day Enrichment Program participants may join our Summer Day Camp for a full day of activities. Students will be escorted between programs by our staff. Rate: 20% off **full-time** Summer Day Camp tuition. Only one discount applies. Extended Day

Extended hours are available from 7:30—9:00 AM and from 4:00—6:00 PM at a rate of \$8 per morning, \$10 per afternoon or \$60 per week (AM/PM all week). If you would like to register for the Extended Day Program, please complete the "Extended Day" column of the Enrichment Registration Form. Students will be escorted between programs by our staff.

Drop-Off and Pick-Up Procedures

Summer Enrichment Drop-Off and Pick-Up will take place in front of the set of doors labeled D6 & D7 located opposite the main staff and student parking lot at the side entrance of the high school. In order to keep traffic flowing, please enter the high school via Vietnam Veteran's Memorial Drive off of Ruggles Street and watch for our signboard. Please be prompt. If you need to speak to a member of the staff, please park in the parking lot and escort your child into the building to room C116, the Community Education Summer Programs Office. Signs will be clearly posted.

Late Drop-Offs

Children who arrive late must be escorted into the Community Education Summer Programs Office located in room C116 on the first floor of the high school. Please enter the building through the set of doors labeled D6 & D7 located opposite the main staff and student parking lot at the side entrance of the high school. Once you sign your child in with a member of our staff, you are free to go. Signs will be clearly posted.
